STEP 2 CHOOSE YOUR MEAL PLAN

- Meal Plan A: Unlimited visits to the Dining Hall plus 100 Cardinal Dollars (\$1,625 per semester)** First-year students will have a choice of Plan A or Plan B. Meal Plan A is designed for students who may want to stop in and have a meal without the restriction of set numbers of meals per week. Students can come in as many times as they choose during operating hours to get either a full meal or just take care of their munchies. In addition, this plan also allows students 100 "Cardinal" Dollars that they can spend at the Perch or in the Cage. Plan participants may also use these Cardinal Dollars to treat their friends to a meal in the Dining Hall.
- Meal Plan B: 15 meals per week plus 200 Cardinal Dollars (\$1,600 per semester)** This is the second choice that first-year students can select. This plan is more traditional and economical and structured for those students with fixed schedules that allow them to eat during regular serving hours. Students on this plan will be able to enjoy 15 meals per week Sunday – Saturday. The plan also includes an additional 200 Cardinal Dollars which can be used in the Cage, the Perch or to treat friends or family in any food service venue.
- Meal Plan C: 200 Block plus 350 Cardinal Dollars (\$1,505 per semester)** The 200 block plan is offered to upper-classmen as an "add-on" to Plans A or B. Upper-classmen have the additional option of purchasing 200 meals per semester which may be used anytime the Dining Hall is open during regular hours. Students may choose to eat 1, 2 or 3 meals per day. This plan also allows students to bring in guest and use one of the blocks. It is set up as a declining balance.
- Commuter Plan: (\$525 per semester)** For the convenience of our students not living on campus, we offer a commuter plan that consists of four meals per week in the Dining Hall plus 125 Cardinal Dollars per semester which may be used at any dining venue. Why lose your parking spot and go off campus between classes? This plan is very economical and convenient.
