Academic Awards:	A+ Award (Transfer)	<p>– <i>GPA requirements must be maintained as follows:</i> 3.0 CUM GPA for partial tuition award; 3.5 CUM GPA for full tuition award.</p> <p><i>Scholarship Probation:</i> If the minimum requirement of 3.0 CUM GPA (partial tuition award) and 3.5 CUM GPA (full tuition award) has not been maintained, a grace period of one semester will apply. In this event, it is your responsibility to contact the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarship Services to receive a subsequent award if you achieve the CUM GPA requirement at semester's end.</p>

Grant Awards:	Academic Competitiveness Grant (Federal)	– Funded by the Federal Government and based on demonstrated financial need. The Academic Competitiveness Grant (ACG) requires the satisfactory completion of a rigorous secondary school curriculum and a cumulative GPA of 3.0 with the final award determination dependent upon review of the student's final high school transcript. Available to 1st and 2nd year students only.
	Access Missouri Grant	– Estimated Award funding anticipated through the State of Missouri. Awarded to eligible Missouri residents with demonstrated financial need.
	Cardinal Grant	– Funds specifically designated and funded by William Jewell College. Award <i>may</i> be based on financial need with reduction possible if recipient qualifies for other grant/scholarship awards. <i>Note:</i> Funds also may represent matching dollars for selected regional scholarship programs.
	Federal Pell Grant	– Funded by the Federal Government and based on demonstrated financial need.

Grant Awards (cont):	Federal SEO Grant	– Funded by the Federal Government and based on demonstrated financial need. Priority is given to Federal Pell Grant recipients with reduction possible if recipient qualifies for other grant/scholarship awards.
	Grant-In-Aid	– Funds specifically designated and funded by William Jewell College. Includes matching dollars for selected regional scholarship programs.
	Heritage Award	– Awarded to children of William Jewell College graduates or siblings of William Jewell College current students or graduates.
	Leadership and Service Grant*	– Awarded based on demonstrated potential for leadership and service. Priority is given to students demonstrating financial need with reduction possible if recipient qualifies for other grant/scholarship awards.
	National SMART Grant (Federal)	– Funded by the Federal Government and based on demonstrated financial need. Available to 3rd and 4th year students in specific degree programs.
	Out-of-State Grant	– Non-Missouri Residents Only. Awarded in an effort to offset the loss of state grant eligibility incurred when attending a college outside of the home state with reduction possible if recipient qualifies for other grant/scholarship awards.
	Tuition Exchange	– Students must maintain Standards of Satisfactory Academic Progress as established by William Jewell College. In addition, U.S. Citizens must complete the FAFSA annually.
	Tuition Remission	– Tuition remission (waiver) based on employee or employee dependent eligibility. Note: Degree-seeking employee dependents must maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress as established by William Jewell College. In addition, the FAFSA must also be completed annually.
Loan Programs:	Federal Parent (PLUS) Loan	– A Federal Loan not based on need, but based on parent borrower credit-worthiness with interest rate fixed at 8.5%. Proceeds will be disbursed in two equal installments and repayment will begin within 60 days of loan being fully disbursed. An origination and Federal Default Fee of up to 4.0% will automatically be deducted from loan proceeds. The parent borrower must initiate the online process by completing the Application/Promissory Note online and a credit check will be pulled almost instantly. An electronic signature option is available. As a Federal Parent Loan borrower, you have the right to cancel all or a portion of the loan within 30 days of loan disbursement. The cancellation may be requested in writing or electronic format.

Federal Perkins Loan

- This is low-interest (5% fixed rate) with William Jewell College serving as the lender. During the in-school (at least half-time status) and grace period of nine months, you will not be responsible for interest. Repayment will begin at the expiration of the grace period. Depending on your total indebtedness, repayment may extend up to 10 years. Minimum monthly payment begins at \$40.

Loan Programs (cont):**Federal Perkins Loan (cont)**

Note: If you accept the Federal Perkins Loan, a promissory note will be mailed to you and must be signed and returned to the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarship Services before loan proceeds will be credited to your student account.

Other information to note:

- (1) In some cases, the acceptance of the Federal Perkins Loan can affect eligibility for other forms of financial assistance;
- (2) This loan will be reported to a credit bureau at the time of loan disbursement;
- (3) Federal Perkins Loan borrowers must complete an entrance interview prior to loan disbursement and an exit interview prior to leaving the College (loan consolidation and refinancing information will be available at that time);
- (4) A borrower cannot cancel student loan debt in the future on the basis of any present impairment unless that condition substantially deteriorates, but borrowers may, however, qualify for loan cancellation based on qualifying service.

As a Federal Perkins Loan borrower, you have the right to cancel all or a portion of the loan within 30 days of loan disbursement. The cancellation may be requested in writing or electronic format.

Loan Programs (cont):**Federal Stafford Subsidized Loan**

- A need-based Federal loan with interest rate fixed at 6.8% prior to July 1, 2008 and 6.0% after July 1, 2008. Proceeds will be disbursed in two equal installments with an origination and Federal Default Fee of up to 3.0% deducted from loan proceeds. Interest is paid by the U.S. Government while enrolled at least half-time and through a 6-month grace period at which time repayment of interest/principal become your responsibility. First-time Stafford borrowers must complete online entrance counseling. You have the right to cancel all or a portion of the loan within 30 days of loan disbursement with request in writing or electronic format.

Federal Stafford Unsubsidized Loan

- Non-need-based Federal loan with interest rate fixed at 6.8%. Proceeds will be disbursed in two equal installments with an origination and Federal Default Fee of up to 3.0% deducted from loan proceeds. Interest is paid by the U.S. Government while enrolled at least half-time and through a 6-month grace period at which time repayment of interest/principal become your responsibility. First-time Stafford borrowers must complete online entrance counseling. You have the right to cancel all or a portion of the loan within 30 days of loan disbursement with request in writing or electronic format.

Federal Nursing Student Loan

- This is low-interest (5% fixed rate) with William Jewell College serving as the lender. During the in-school (at least half-time status) and grace period of nine months, you will not be responsible for interest. Repayment will begin at the expiration of the grace period. Depending on your total indebtedness, repayment may extend up to 10 years. Minimum monthly payment begins at \$40.

Note: If you accept the Federal Nursing Loan, a promissory note will be mailed to you and must be signed and returned to the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarship Services before loan proceeds will be credited to your student account.

Loan Programs (cont):	Private Alternative Loan	– Privately-funded loan (non-Federal) with competitive interest rate. In-school deferment of interest and principal is available. A credit-worthy co-endorser may be required.
Scholarship Awards:	Christian-Related Vocation Award	– Awarded based on the pursuit of a full-time or part-time ministry after college. Recipients must enroll in a ministry course for academic credit and participate in the Christian-Related Vocation Program. 	Church Partnership Match Award	– Funded by William Jewell College (up to \$250 per semester) based on scholarship award provided by participating church.
	Designated Scholarship	– Scholarship awarded based on information you provided to the William Jewell College Office of Financial Aid and Scholarship Services. Your donor has submitted the scholarship proceeds in your behalf.
	Designated Scholarship Pending	– Scholarship awarded based on information you provided to the William Jewell College Office of Financial Aid and Scholarship Services. The pending designation signifies that your donor has not yet submitted the scholarship proceeds in your behalf.
	Eagle Scout	– Funded by William Jewell College and based on the rank of Eagle Scout.
	Endowed Scholarship(s)	– Scholarship(s) funded by William Jewell College Endowed Scholarship and donors.
	Girls' State Leadership Award	– Funded by William Jewell College and based on participation in Girl's State.
	IES Scholarship	– IES (International Exchange) Scholarship awarded based on information you provided to the William Jewell College Office of Financial aid and Scholarship Services.

	Marguerite Ross Barnett Scholarship	– Funded by the State of Missouri and awarded on the basis of demonstrated financial need, half-time (minimum of 6 credit hours, not to exceed 11 credit hours) enrollment, and employment off-campus (non-Federal Work Study) for a minimum of 20 hours per week).
	Marian Greene Education Fellowship*	– Funded by William Jewell College Endowed Scholarship for majors in education. Award is equal to one-quarter of tuition (excluding activity fees) for first-year students entering Fall 2004. Award is equal to one-half of tuition (excluding activity fees) for first-year students entering Fall 2003 or earlier. A cumulative GPA of 3.0 must be maintained.
	Minister's Dependent Grant*	– Awarded to the dependent children or spouse of an individual who has a full-time professional position with a church or denomination which provides the principal source of income.
Scholarship Awards (cont.):	Missouri Higher Education Academic Scholarship	– The Bright Flight Scholarship is available to graduating high school seniors residing in Missouri who have scored in the top 3% of all Missouri students taking the ACT/SAT. Satisfactory Academic Progress Standards governing William Jewell College financial aid programs must be maintained. The State of Missouri requires a minimum of 2.5 cumulative GPA for renewal eligibility.
	Missouri Teacher Education Scholarship	– This competitive award is for Missouri students who plan to major in education and who rank in the top 15% of those completing the ACT/SAT test. Non-renewable. William Jewell College provides a match in the amount of \$1,000 (see separate award).
	Missouri Teacher Education - Match	– Funded by William Jewell College. Award is the required matching funds for recipients of the Missouri Teacher Education Scholarship Program. Non-renewable.
	Pastor's Award*	– Award to first-time entering students who are Baptist Church members.
	Scholar Recognition Day Award	– Award for participation in the Scholar Recognition Day event.
	Vocational Rehabilitation	– Funded by the State of Missouri for eligible students with a certified impairment. Questions regarding the program/benefits should be directed to your designated Vocational Rehabilitation counselor.
Talent Awards:	Wyatt Boy's State Art Award	– Funded by William Jewell College and based on participation in Boy's State.
