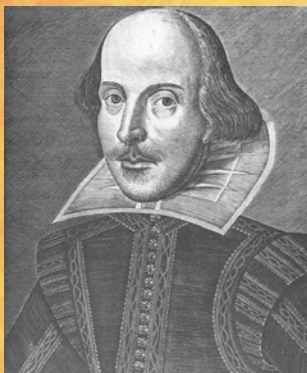
Art and religion don't mix. Politics and religion don't mix. Or they do depending on who is controlling the mix.
