- Develop a basic understanding of biological principles, facts, and concepts;
- Develop a basic understanding of chemical principles, facts, and concepts;
- Develop expertise in the methodologies of field and lab;
- Learn to think critically in interdisciplinary contexts;
- Develop research and communication skills related to philosophical and scientific investigation.

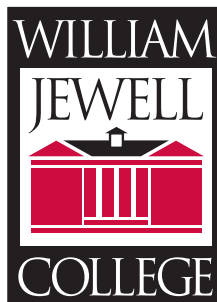
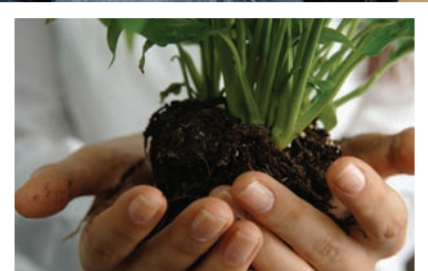
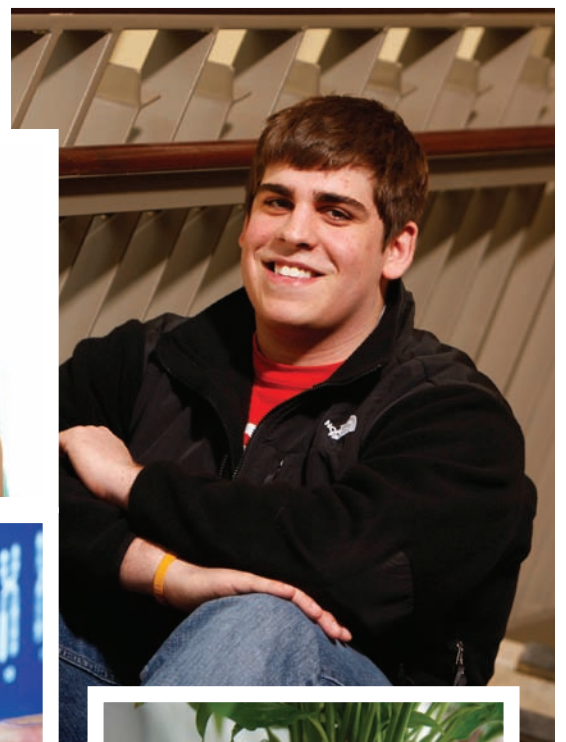

About the Major

All students will obtain a basic grounding in the fields of biology and chemistry, and then explore the application of contemporary moral theory in both biomedical and environmental contexts. Students will also reflect upon fundamental philosophical questions pertaining to the scientific enterprise itself. Finally, all students will finish their study with a semester-long practicum, in collaboration with a bioethicist, where they can relate what they have learned in the classroom to concrete situations in the work environment. Students majoring in bioethics must complete all requirements for the B.A. degree.
