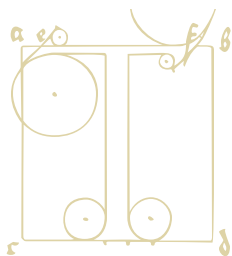


Are you ready to broaden your mind?



The Department of Political Science stands out at William Jewell because it challenges students to learn how the real world works and to engage in the great debates about how it should work. Current domestic and foreign policies are explored and alternatives to current policies discussed. Students in the department are regularly debating U.S. policy in Iraq, European Union expansion, and whether Machiavelli really is a teacher of evil. They conduct high-level research in democratization and war ethics. Through it all, students explore the world of political science carefully and learn to articulate their opinions, develop solutions, and present alternatives.

Distinctives

Students will develop skills that are applicable to the professional world. As political science majors, students enjoy a diverse and complete experience that allows them to pursue a variety of career paths and win admission into prestigious graduate and professional programs.

Political Science and International Relations majors are equipped to address relevant social issues with sharp research and careful analysis. Upon graduation, students go on to work at the Federal Reserve, Capitol Hill, graduate and doctoral degrees, and the U.S. Military.

- Many political science majors take advantage of one of Jewell's twenty-two overseas study programs. Recent students studied at Oxford, the Sorbonne in Paris, Vienna, Austria, Germany, Japan, Costa Rica, Israel/Palestine, Beirut, and Spain;
- Students regularly secure paid internships on Capitol Hill, while others have interned in national, state, and local campaigns, at the embassies of the Kingdom of Jordan

- Students can intern in the department's Missouri Legislative Internship program, with a spring semester's residence at the State Capitol in Jefferson City;
- Students obtain mentorships in the Kansas City metro area at the FBI, the Federal Reserve, and the Jackson and Platte County Prosecutor's Offices.
