NURSING APPLICATION SUPPLEMENT INSTRUCTIONS AND APPLICATION ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING (BSN)

Students may apply for the Bachelor of Science in Nursing program as either a First-Year Direct-Entry student or as a Transfer student from another college or university.

BSN Application Checklist (completed application must be received by deadline for priority consideration):

- William Jewell College Application
- Nursing Application Supplement
- Official High School and/or College Transcripts
- ACT and SAT-I Test Scores (Direct-Entry Applicants Only)
- Two letters of recommendation (Transfer Only)
- Personal Statement (Applicants should **substitute** the Personal Statement outlined on the reverse side of this Application Supplement for the Personal Statement described on the Application for Admission & Scholarship)
- Activities Résumé (Direct-Entry Only)
- \$25 Application Fee (Waived for on-line applications)

First-Year Direct-Entry Application Criteria

Application Priority Date: December 1

The Office of Admission must receive your completed (must include all checklist items) Application for Admission and Scholarship no later than **December 1** in order to provide priority consideration for admission. Notification of a decision can be expected on or before **March 1**.

Minimum requirements for regular admission to the BSN program (meeting these requirements does not guarantee admission)

- Cumulative Grade Point Average of 3.0 or higher (on a 4.0 scale) in a college preparatory curriculum
- ACT composite test score of 24 or SAT of 1110 (CR + Math)

Transfer Application Criteria

Application Deadline: June 1.

The Office of Admission must receive your completed (must include all checklist items) Application for Admission and Scholarship no later than **June 1**. Admission decisions will be conveyed to candidates by **June 30** for enrollment the following spring term. [Candidates must also take the TEAS test administered by the Nursing department.]

Minimum requirements for regular admission to the BSN program (meeting these requirements does not guarantee admission)

- Cumulative Grade Point Average of 2.50 or higher (on a 4.0 scale)
- Grade of "C" or better in all Nursing prerequisites
- Must have completed 24 or more transferable credit hours from an accredited college or university

The following prerequisite courses must be completed prior to beginning the BSN program:

- Chemistry with a lab
- Anatomy with a lab
- Introduction to Psychology
- Physiology with a lab

A personal interview may be required for applicants and will be scheduled by the Nursing department.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING- ACCELERATED TRACK (BSN-AT)

In addition to submitting the items listed below, candidates for the BSN-AT Program must schedule a formal meeting with the Nursing Department and must take the TEAS test (Test of Essential Academic Skills) administered by the Nursing Department at an additional cost.

BSN-AT Application Checklist (completed application file must be received by deadline for priority consideration):

- William Jewell College Application for Admission and Scholarship
- Nursing Application Supplement
- Official College transcripts
- Two Letters of Recommendation (academic or professional) that address the candidates character and ability to complete a twelve month, intensive course of study.
- Personal Statement (Applicants should **substitute** the Personal Statement outlined on the reverse side of this Application Supplement for the Personal Statement described on the Application for Admission & Scholarship)
- \$25 Application Fee (Waived for on-line applications)

Application Deadline: August 1

The Office of Admission must receive your completed (must include all checklist items) Application for Admission and Scholarship no later than **August 1**. Admission decisions will be conveyed to candidates by August 31st for enrollment the following May. [Candidates must also take the TEAS test administered by the Nursing department.]

Minimum requirements for admission to the BSN-AT program (meeting these requirements does not guarantee admission)

- Baccalaureate (BA or BS) or higher degree completed by December of the year prior to beginning the program. Degree must be from a regionally accredited institution.
- Cumulative Grade Point Average of 2.50 or higher (on a 4.0 scale)
- Grade of "C" or better in all Nursing prerequisite courses.

The following prerequisite courses must be completed prior to beginning the BSN-AT program:

- Chemistry with a lab
- Anatomy with a lab
- Introduction to Psychology
- Physiology with a lab
- Microbiology with a lab
- Nutrition
- Pathophysiology

A personal interview is required for applicants and will be scheduled by the Nursing department.
