

POST-BACCALAUREATE TEACHER EDUCATION ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Once a person already possesses a baccalaureate degree he/she does not apply for regular undergraduate teacher education admission but for post-baccalaureate education admission. If the applicant is not a WJC graduate he/she must first apply for admission to the college and then (or simultaneously) apply to teacher education.

Post-baccalaureate applicants must meet the following requirements to be accepted into the Teacher Education Program:

1. Submit an application for admission to teacher education (these can be found in print form outside of Marston 110 and electronically in the appendix of this handbook).
2. Submission of transcripts from ALL colleges and universities previously attended, including any in which the applicant is currently enrolled.
3. The following minimum grade point averages (g.p.a.):
 - a. Overall g.p.a. of 2.8
 - b. Undergraduate g.p.a. of 3.0
1. Submission of an acceptable standardized test score appropriate to the program for which the applicant is applying as follows:
 - a. Applying to the Elementary Teacher Education program: score a 300 on the composite of the C-BASE or
 - b. Applying to the Secondary Teacher Education program: Pass the content field Praxis II subject area assessment for the field in which you majored and that you want to teach.
2. No grade below C (meaning C- is not acceptable) in the content field (area of concentration for elementary; content major for secondary) AND in completed education coursework.

No 300 level Education classes may be taken until a student has been admitted to teacher education.

A "C-" is not equivalent to a "C" for the purposes of teacher certification and therefore cannot count for meeting any Education or teaching content field requirement.
