

2004-05 William Jewell College Greek Achievements

Greek Life at William Jewell College is an important component of the campus culture. Most importantly, Jewell Greeks maintain high academic standards for their members. Here is a synopsis of just some of the contributions and accomplishments of the Greeks at William Jewell College during the 2004-05 academic year.

Scholarship

Fall 2004

- First year Greek students obtained higher GPA's than non-Greek first year students.
- Six of the Seven Greek organizations earned averages at or above a 3.0. The lowest Greek organization GPA was 2.965

Spring 2005

- All Greek organizations earned an average of 3.0 or higher.
- Six of seven Greek organizations academically exceeded or were equal to their respective all-woman/man grade point averages. The one organization that didn't was within .09 grade points.

Service and Philanthropy

- WJC Greeks performed 7,962 hours of community service work.
- \$11,200 was raised by WJC Greeks for various service organizations.
- \$4,800 was raised by WJC Greeks in support of their national/international organizations.
