

## Honors Projects

Many students who study as juniors in Jewell's programs in Oxford and Cambridge qualify to do Honors Projects. If you are interested, consult the chairman of the Honors Council before you leave. (The chairman is identified in the committee list toward the back of the Catalog.) In the past few years the Council has deferred deadlines for students overseas, but may not always be able to do so. Get the schedule and the guidelines clear before you go.

Before you go it is especially important for you to get a faculty member to agree to direct your project and to choose with her/him at least a broad topic on which you can begin research while you are in England. It is not practical to try to negotiate these matters by transatlantic mail and phone calls once you are overseas. It would also be very difficult to complete an entire Honors Project during the fall and early spring of your senior year after your return.

## Requesting a Transcript While Overseas

Federal law prohibits William Jewell College (and other colleges and universities) from issuing your official transcript without your signature. Telephone calls and e-mail messages are not acceptable substitutes. If you request a transcript while overseas (for a graduate school or fellowship application, for example) you must submit a request in writing, delivered by person, by fax or through the postal service. No exceptions are possible.
