

**GREEK STRATEGIC PLAN**  
**STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES**  
**Thursday, February 9, 2006**

**Overview of the Strategic Plan**

Distributed detailed version of the plan.

**Reports**

- **Academic Report**
  - Distributed Fall Grade Report: very positive
- **IFC, Panhellenic, Greek Council Presidents' Reports**
  - Panhellenic and Greek Council: main goal is to make a more prominent name for itself by doing more inter-sorority philanthropy, sponsoring speakers, all sorority mixer; working on Greek week with IFC; Greek achievement ceremony; Order of Omega; working on Greek Newsletter; working on all-Greek calendar
  - IFC: all-fraternity service project each semester; working on rush and new member education; working on a positive image for Greek like for prospective members; more all-Greek socials, as well as more all-fraternity social activities; finding ways to attract new Jewell students to the Greek system; looking forward to the return of Sigma Nu; all IFC officers went to Chicago to the IFC workshop and training.
- **Future Undergraduate Leadership and Training:** Ernie is researching possibilities and is looking for ways to help support Greek leadership development; suggestion raised to look into grants for sending students to these programs.
  - **Recruitment Boot Camp:** hosted by Campus Speak; a way to bring all those involved in recruitment together and develop values based recruitment
  - **UIFI:** Greek leadership program
  - **Leadershape:** Student leadership workshop
- **Dr. Sallee's conferences with organizational executives:** Dr. Sallee, Rick, and Ernie had conference calls with the executives of each organization; talked about strategic plan, sorority complex, and initiatives, and received a very positive response. The national offices offered to send individuals to help with various areas of the strategic plan.

**Updates**

- **AIFC:** Several alumni researched AIFC's at various universities and developed a plan that might work for the Greek system at Jewell. Suggesting 9 members (one from each organization plus a president) on

the board to serve as a support for students, organizing and connecting alumni, help with fundraising. The AIFC will be independent of the college. Michelle asked for suggestions from the Steering Committee. The researching alumni will soon begin working on recruiting the 9 founding members.

- **Sigma Nu Update:** Group of alumni has been working to bring chapter back to WJC, formal permission was granted this past fall. Nine alumni are committed and are meeting monthly. The alumni have gone through their own strategic planning process and have developed a strong vision with which to proceed. They have also developed a values based recruiting committee. They are currently lacking a chapter advisor. Sigma Nu will participate in Fall 2006 recruitment. Staff from Sigma Nu headquarters have been at WJC several times recently and has met with IFC to request permission to participate in recruitment. IFC was very willing to accept Sigma Nu.
- **Sorority Complex:** Presentation by Mayella Esser, head of fundraising for the sorority complex project. \$10 million project. WJC has committed \$4 million. Currently securing lead gifts with naming opportunities—at present, they have \$1 million left to raise of their lead gifts. They will be approaching the Kresge and Mabee foundations for challenge grants.
- **Greek Judiciary Council:** Chapters have done nominations, interviews have taken place, and we have a trained council. Ernie is going to do some more training with the Panhellenic and IFC presidents on the role of the chief justices.
- **Phi Gamma Delta:** Ernie reviewed the sequence of events that SA took in investigating allegations. SA has been in communication with headquarters. SA has prepared report and distributed it to the appropriate people. Rick Winslow is currently at the Phi Gamma Delta headquarters meeting with executives regarding the situation. Ernie noted that the men of Phi Gamma Delta have been very cooperative. Most likely this will go before the Greek Judiciary.
- **Greek Summit:** Training/leadership summit. Get strategic plan information out to undergraduates, chapter assessments, goal setting. Leaders will also be reminded of resources available to them.
- **New Greek Resources Site:** all information and resources from the Greek Summit is now online.

**Goalsetting:** Reviewed progress report. Each member of the committee was given three stickers, each a different color, with which they were to rank their top three goal priorities for the next year. Individuals had opportunity to advocate for their choice for goal priorities. We will total the votes, talk with IFC and Panhellenic, and will propose timeline and will then send a time line to Steering Committee to vote yes or no.

Questions raised regarding assessing the effectiveness of the action plans we have completed. We may need to look for assessment tools and may need to develop

new action plans for various goals. Questions also raised regarding the frequency of assessing the by-in and effectiveness of the plan.

Suggestion raised of holding a presentation similar to the roll-out to demonstrate the progress that has been made. IFC is actually already planning a presentation to the Greek men regarding the NIC standards and the ways that each chapter should be abiding by the standards. Also, during the achievement program in April, there will be a celebration of the accomplishments. At the Greek Summit on Feb. 11, there will be a presentation of the GSP to all Greek undergraduate leaders.

Nelson suggested using a Jewell Community time for PR both with Greeks and non-Greeks. It would be great to do this on the Friday of Greek Week.
