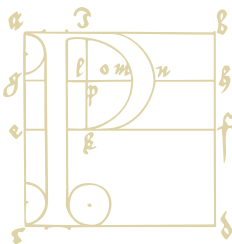


Are you ready to free your mind?

Distinctives

There is no set path for psychology majors. There are some required courses for all majors but with versatile application and elective classes, there are endless possibilities for students in this discipline. Relatively small class sizes and personal attention allow students to develop relationships with their professors and better understand their choices for the future. - Students explore major theories and empirical data of psychology. Our field practicum program offers the opportunity for first-hand experience with the mental health service system;
