Commuter Eligibility

To live off-campus, a student must meet one or more of the following:

1. senior status (90+ credit hours or 6 chronological semesters of *full-time attendance);
2. married and/or have dependent child(ren);
3. age 22 or older;
4. taking less than 12 credit hours;
5. **living with parent/legal guardian;
6. *** living in parent-/legal guardian-owned property other than family home
7. receiving no Jewell-funded scholarships or grants.

**Full-time defined as 12+ credit hours fall/spring & 6+ credit hours summer*

***within a 50-mile radius of the College *** proof of ownership required*

Residence Hall Descriptions

Browning Hall

Browning is an upper-class hall with some private rooms, housing about 127. Each room has a sink and medicine cabinet/mirror. The building is co-ed, with separate key access for men and women. The bathrooms are community (shower stalls), located on each wing of the building.

Eaton Hall

The first-year men's hall, Eaton houses about 142 men. Mostly double occupancy rooms, there are also two 4-person rooms. The bathrooms are community (shower stalls), located on each wing of every floor. Eaton and Ely are neighbors!

Ely Hall

One of two first-year women's halls, Ely houses about 138 women. Mostly double occupancy rooms, there are also four 3-person rooms. The bathrooms are community (shower stalls), located on each wing of each floor. Ely and Eaton are neighbors!

Jones Hall

Another upper-class building, Jones houses 41. The building is co-ed, with separate key access for men and women. The bathrooms are community (shower stalls), located on each wing of each floor of the building.

Language Honors

An upper-class women's hall, housing 50 women. Mostly double occupancy rooms, there are also three 4-person rooms. The bathrooms are community (shower stalls), located on each wing of every floor throughout the facility.

Melrose Hall

Melrose underwent a complete renovation in 2003! One of two first-year women's halls, Melrose houses about 75 women. The bathrooms are suite style, meaning two double-occupancy rooms are joined by a full bathroom to share among the four women.

Seiple Hall and Wing

An upper-class hall, Seiple houses about 181 women. As the hall that includes all four sorority wings, Seiple is a diverse mix of independent and Greek members. The bathrooms are community (shower stalls), located on each wing of every floor throughout the facility. Seiple is our largest women's facility and offers a significant number of single occupancy rooms.
